Activities were wet and wild and tested pupils' skills and sense of adventure with canoeing, orienteering and climbing. 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KS4 Learn The Meaning of Life

Year 10 and Year 11 pupils spent Curriculum Enrichment Day earning a QCF/Ofqual registered qualification in Emergency First Aid at Work. This gives the participants a certificated qualification that lasts 3 years.

One aim of the course was to up-skill students by increasing their employability skills. Adding this qualification to their CV will help them to move on at 16+ and secure part time work.

We also know that this credential will help applicants to stand out in a crowd. It is often a point of conversation for college admissions tutors who recognise that our pupils have endeavoured to gain a worthwhile qualification

It goes without saying that the skills and knowledge gained will give all KS4 learners the confidence to act and help, should they ever find themselves or others in need of emergency first aid support.
