## Meet the New Head of Maths

As the new Head of Maths, Mr McNaught has already implemented weekly GCSE booster sessions for Year 11 pupils and runs individual drop-in sessions after school for all year groups. The department is constantly looking to develop new initiatives for pupils from the Numeracy Ninjas programme to improve skills in KS3, to Functional Skills that supplement their GCSE studies and a fun weekly Pi Club.

Mr McNaught has been teaching Maths at HHGS for 8 years. An inspirational Maths teacher, a natural fondness for the subject and a desire to garner that enthusiasm in others is what led him to teaching.

He said, "I get a great buzz out of helping young people with Maths and encouraging them to be curious, to explore and to make links and spot patterns in the classroom and outside of it.

I enjoy working with pupils who say they dislike Maths and convincing them otherwise, or helping our more able pupils think about Maths beyond the GCSE curriculum and post-16. The best thing, however, is the point a pupil reaches when they take responsibility for their learning and you see a real development and maturity as they progress in class. That is the stage where I'm no longer in control of a pupil's achievement; instead, they've taken over the responsibility themselves and you see a desire on the pupil's part to achieve. That is a pleasure to see!"
