We have been working on Place Value in Maths this week and some of the children found using Base 10 very helpful.

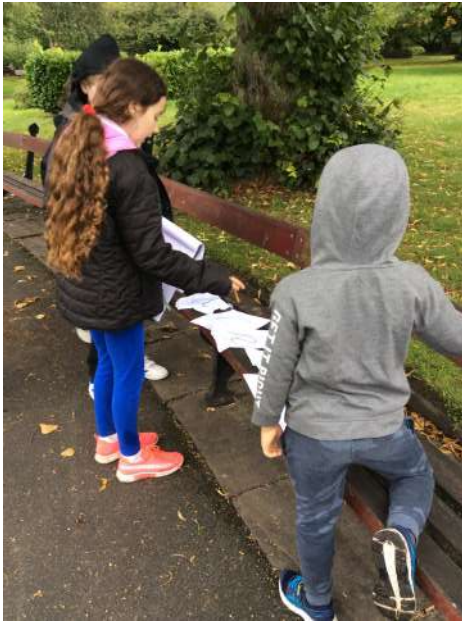

Revolutionary Artists

On Wednesday and Thursday the children learned about one of the most famous images of the French Revolution. The ***Death of Marat*** (French: La Mort de ***Marat*** or ***Marat*** Assassiné) is a 1793 ***painting*** by Jacques-Louis David of the murdered French revolutionary leader Jean-Paul ***Marat***.

After hearing the story behind the painting, the children looked at the proportions of the painting and the colours used. They enjoyed mixing prime colours to get different shades of skin tone and Heidi said the best part of her painting was mixing the particular shade of brown for the box. The A3 size paintings look great on our French Revolution display board!
